Can I apply for more than one apprenticeship/traineeship?

Yes, you can apply for more than one apprenticeship/traineeship. If you progress through the process, you will be required to choose which discipline you will progress with.

Do I need a colour blind test if I want to apply for an Electrical Apprenticeship?

You must provide written evidence of satisfactory completion of a colour blind test. Colour blind testing can be undertaken at an optometrist.

What are the education requirements?

Prerequisites for 2020 Year 12 Leavers

- Diesel Fitter, Mechanical Fitter and Parks and Gardens: Year 10 completed or completing with SA or higher in English and Math.
- Electrical Apprenticeship: Year 10 completed with SA or higher in English and a high level of Math. Candidates for Electrical Fitter Mechanic Apprenticeship must provide evidence of satisfactory completion of a colour blind test. Colour blind testing can be undertaken at an optometrist.
- CAD Traineeship: Minimum of Year 12 with SA or higher in English, Math and relevant technical subjects. Competence with computers is essential and knowledge of CAD software would be highly desirable. To be considered for this traineeship all applicants must be willing and/or able to obtain a provisional driver's licence.

Do I need to complete a medical?

Yes. You will be required to complete a pre-employment medical, this will include a physical component.
